In June, 2015, I became involved with the Ukraine War Amps after reading in the EuroMaidan Press that it was a charity assisting the soldiers who were disabled due to the war in Donbas, eastern Ukraine. After communicating with Gene Berezovski who is the organizer along with John Broadhead, I became enthusiastic about helping the unfortunate soldiers and their families in this terrible war for the freedom of all of Ukraine.

In almost all instances, I received thankful letters from the individuals who were helped. What impressed me most was that these recipients were thankful primarily that someone so far away in Canada had not forgotten them! Helping the solders and their families gave and gives me joy.

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress, Saskatchewan Provincial Council, was pleased to promote the wonderful work of UWA in their Newsletter. As well, the Ukrainian Voice in Winnipeg, carried an article about the good works of UWA.

We all are very impressed with the operation of UWA and their effectiveness with providing finances and support to the brave but unfortunate disabled soldiers. These men became disabled because of their patriotism to acquire democracy for their beloved homeland, Ukraine.
